WEBINAR: CONNECTING THE HISTORY OF REDLINING TO CONTEXTUALIZE LOCAL HOUSING POLICY DECISIONS

The Land Use Planning Community of Practice, a working group within the National Association of Community Development Extension Professionals (NACDEP), presents a professional development webinar entitled Connecting the History of Redlining to Contextualize Local Housing Policy Decisions, Wednesday, November 30, Noon-1pm Eastern.

Dr. Craig Carpenter will review the history and legacy of redlining as an important cause of present-day housing inequities. Dr. Carpenter will highlight a new resource - The History of Redlining in Michigan website - created to engage decision-makers in this history and help visualize the lasting effects in their community, tying present-day policy choices to whether they address the lasting effects of redlining.
