





CHAPTER UPDATE FROM THE APA IA PRESIDENT

The Chapter is participating in the National Chapter's Consolidated Election process for consideration of amendments to the Chapter's bylaws. Bylaw amendments may be proposed by the Executive Board of the Chapter. The membership may amend the Bylaws by a majority of those voting by secure electronic ballot. The Chapter board voted on a final recommendation of bylaw amendments at the May meeting and members should have received an email from APA Election Coordinator recently to cast a vote. The changes to the bylaws are intended to provide clarity and direction for the Chapter to continuing operation successfully.

A new division has recently been created at the National American Planning Association, Tribal and Indigenous Planning Division, with the mission "To promote awareness, communication and action on tribal and indigenous planning issues for tribal and indigenous planners, peoples, nations and their non-tribal partners." Many divisions are available for planning specialties and interest areas to connect with a community of professionals.

The fall National Policy and Advocacy Conference will again be held virtually this fall. Look for more information and registration coming soon.

Beginning January 1, 2022, two new mandatory Certification Maintenance credits are required for AICP members. Equity and Sustainability & Resilience. There are over 100 course options available on each topic available through APA Learn and the 2022 Annual Iowa Chapter Conference will offer sessions that meet these requirements in addition to Law and Ethics.

Registration for the 2022 Annual Conference will be available in August for the event happening in Ottumwa October 12-14 at the Bridge View Center.


